Safeguarding the Telecommunications Sector and Ghana's Revenues: President Akufo-Addo commissions NCA-CERT and Common Platform

Accra, 23rd October, 2018 - The President, Nana Addo Dankwa Akufo-Addo, on Monday, 22nd October, 2018, commissioned the National Communications Authority's Computer Emergency Response Team (CERT) centre, and the Revenue Assurance and Traffic Monitoring Centre, also known as the "Common Platform".

The state-of-the-art cyber security centre which is set up to protect Ghana's telecommunication industry and users "was conceptualized by the NCA, designed by the NCA, funded by the NCA, installed by the NCA and manned by the NCA under the leadership of the Ministry of Communications (MOC) and it is perhaps one of the perfect definition of what we mean by having a Ghana Beyond Aid" Director General of the National Communications Authority, Joe Anokye said in his opening remarks to a tumultuous applause from the audience which included industry players, Ministers of State, Members of Parliament and staff of the NCA.

The Minister for Communications, Mrs. Ursula Owusu-Ekuful commended the management of the Ghana Revenue Authority and the National Communications Authority for their hard work in establishing the two centres which will go a long way to help in government's efforts at protecting revenues to the state and safeguarding Ghana's cyberspace. She also called on telecommunication companies to continue to cooperate with the operators of the common platform for the collective good of the industry.

President Akufo-Addo commended the National Communications Authority and the Ghana Revenue Authority for taking steps to guarantee the revenues of government, and, also, ensure that regulators and telecommunication operators work together to this end. The President said the commissioning of the two projects were essential building blocks

for the realization of Government's vision of a digitised Ghana. "They represent key milestones in our nation's journey towards becoming well-resourced, self-reliant, efficient and secure, within the context of cyberspace, telecommunications traffic management, and revenue assurance," he added.

In execution of the protocols for the Computer Emergence Response Team Centre and the Revenue Assurance and Traffic Monitoring Centre, the President indicated that "we should see to the transfer of knowledge to enhance learning and the acquisition of skills by Ghanaians to man this project."

As Co-Chair of the 2030 United Nations Advocates Group of Eminent Personalities for the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), he indicated that these two projects fit directly into the SDGs. "The creation of a state of the art, well-resourced cyber security response centre, such as the NCA-CERT, is key to attaining some of these goals. We have committed ourselves to building a resilient infrastructure, promote sustainable industrialization and foster innovation so we can attain Goal No. 9, which 'addresses three important aspects of sustainable development: infrastructure, industrialization and innovation'," the President added.
